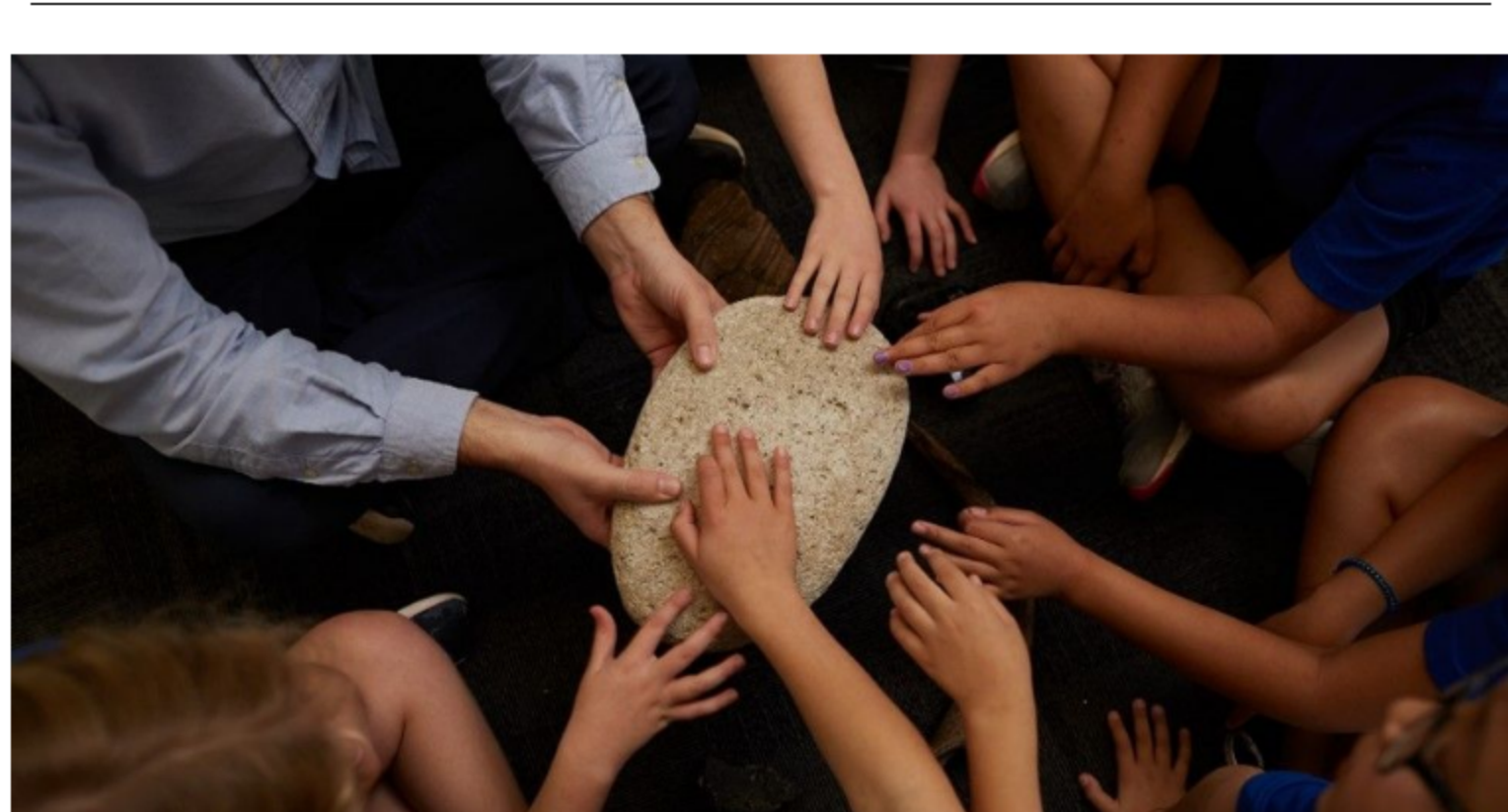
Patterns of the Past

The great human migration and settlement of the Pacific has been widely debated throughout history. Patterns we see across Pacific *tātatau* (tattoo) today carry the stories and histories of civilizations in the past.

With a focus on *tātatau*, explore how practices and traditions survived the journey of human settlement up to the period of Pacific migration to Aotearoa. Find out the meaning and symbolism behind *tātatau* history, patterns and practices. Compare tatau practices today and critique their effects in modern day society.

Pakanga Maunga Puia

Join us for an hour of immersive pūrākau (story telling) exploring the Te Ao Māori world view of maunga puia (volcanoes). Listen to the stories of Ranginui, Papatuānuku, and Ruaumoko. Discover the great battle between Tongariro and his brothers. Learn about the taniwha Tamahoi, Sophia Hinerangi and the waka wairua (ghost ship), and the prophecies of Tūhoro Ariki. Engage with volcanic rocks and make connections to their uses in everyday Māori life.
