## GRAB YOUR BAG AND GO

If there's an eruption, Emergency Management might tell you to evacuate. Get your grab bag ready with these things so you can leave in a hurry.

**Goggles and a mask**  
P2 or N95



**Water**  
Enough to get you to your safe place



**Toy or game**  
To help pass the time



**Warm, weatherproof clothing**  
Including a raincoat, a hat, and sturdy shoes

**First-aid and medication**  
For the whole whānau, and pets too



**Torch**  
And extra batteries



**Food**  
Don't forget food for pets too



**Hand sanitiser**  
Bring soap too, and toilet paper!



**Identification**  
And a list of emergency contacts too



**Cellphone and radio**  
So you can stay informed - don't forget a power bank and extra batteries



## A BIG BANG

While it's unlikely to happen in your lifetime, an eruption in Tāmaki would cause a lot of damage and disruption. You need to be prepared for ash, falling rocks, lava flows, gas, shockwaves, earthquakes, and tsunami.



## WHAT TO DO

### BEFORE AN ERUPTION

- Make an emergency plan and practise it
- Make a grab bag and have emergency supplies at home
- Get to know your neighbours
- Make sure you have enough water
- Check your insurance



### DURING AND AFTER AN ERUPTION

- Follow official instructions
- Bring your pets and animals inside
- Close windows and doors, and stay inside
- If you have to go out, protect your eyes, cover your skin, and wear a mask

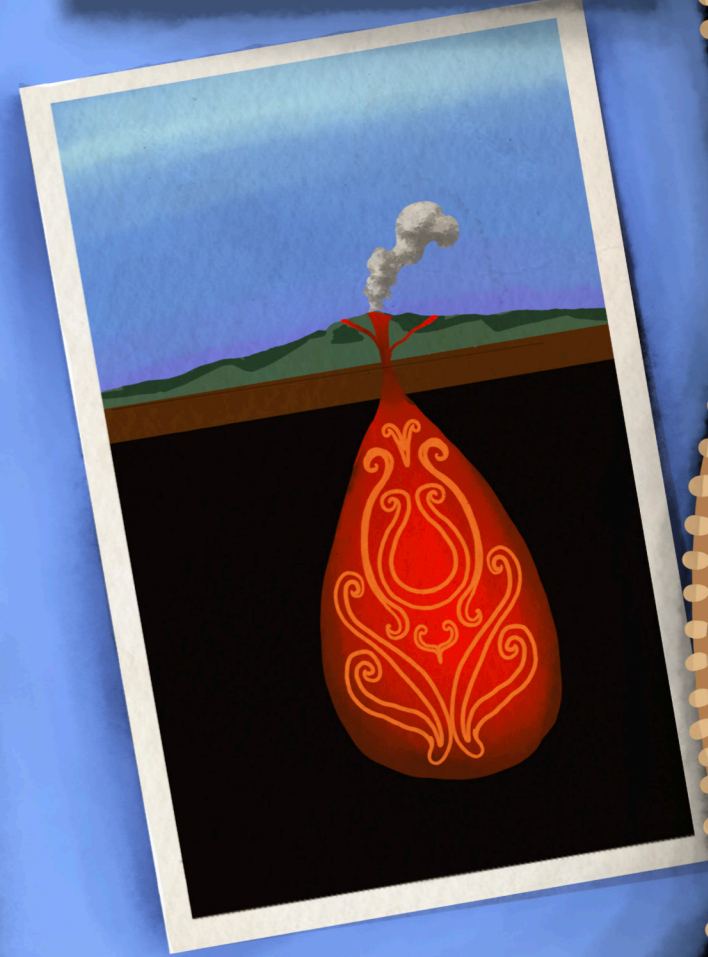


### RANGITOTO

One fiery story about Rangitoto tells that a long time ago, a couple were so busy arguing that they let their fire go out. They cursed Mahuika, the fire goddess, who asked Mataaho to teach them a lesson. Mataaho sent an explosion that made Rangitoto, which became their prison.

### MATAAHO

Mataaho, or Mataoho, is the atua (god) of volcanoes, and he lived in the crater on top of Maungawhau Mount Eden. It's even named Te Ipu-a-Mataoho (the bowl of Mataoho) after him.



### DO YOU KNOW YOUR MAUNGA?

Auckland's volcanic field is made up of maunga (mountains) and other features that don't look like volcanoes, like Lake Pukepuke and Mount Smart.

This volcanic field is young and still active, which is why we need to be prepared.
